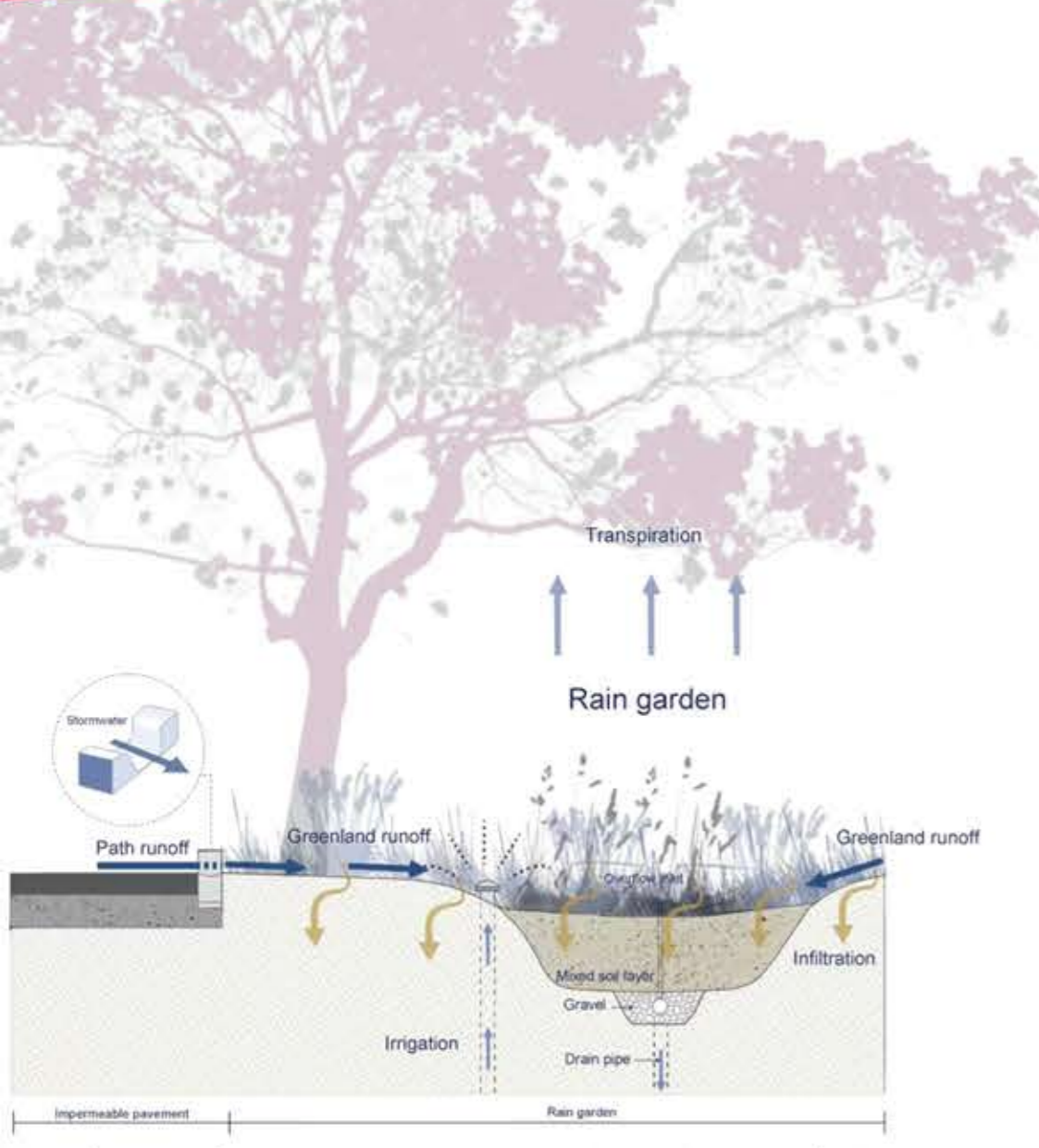
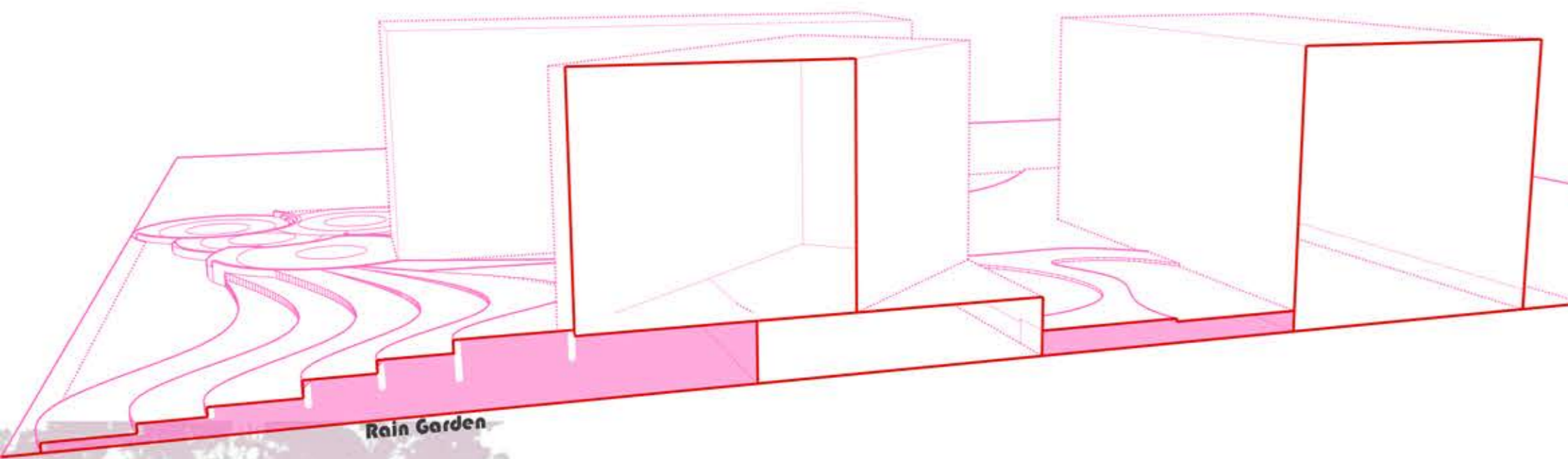


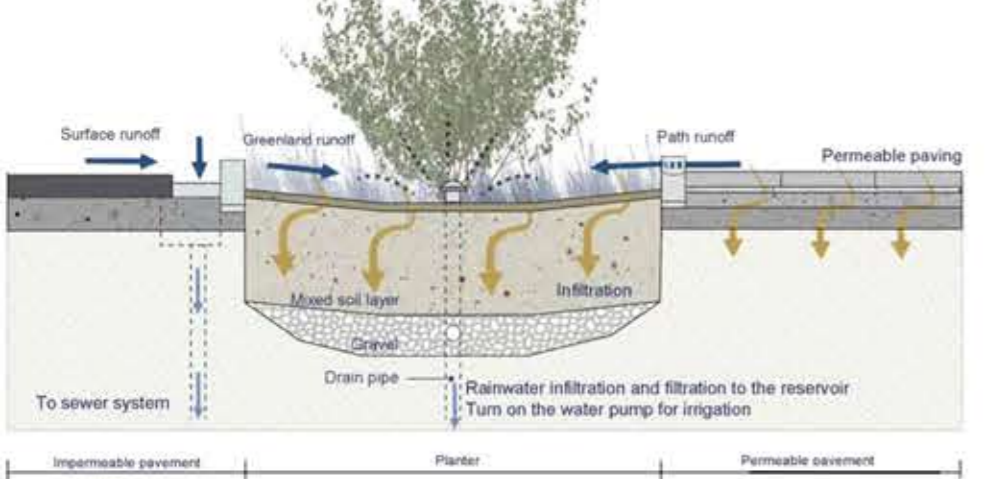
SPIRIT OF THE LAND

Our architectural design concept, "Spirit of the Land," is deeply rooted in the rich heritage and cultural traditions of the First Nation communities. Inspired by the profound connection between Indigenous peoples and the natural environment, our design seeks to pay homage to the land, ancestors, and traditions while creating spaces that foster community, identity, and sustainability.

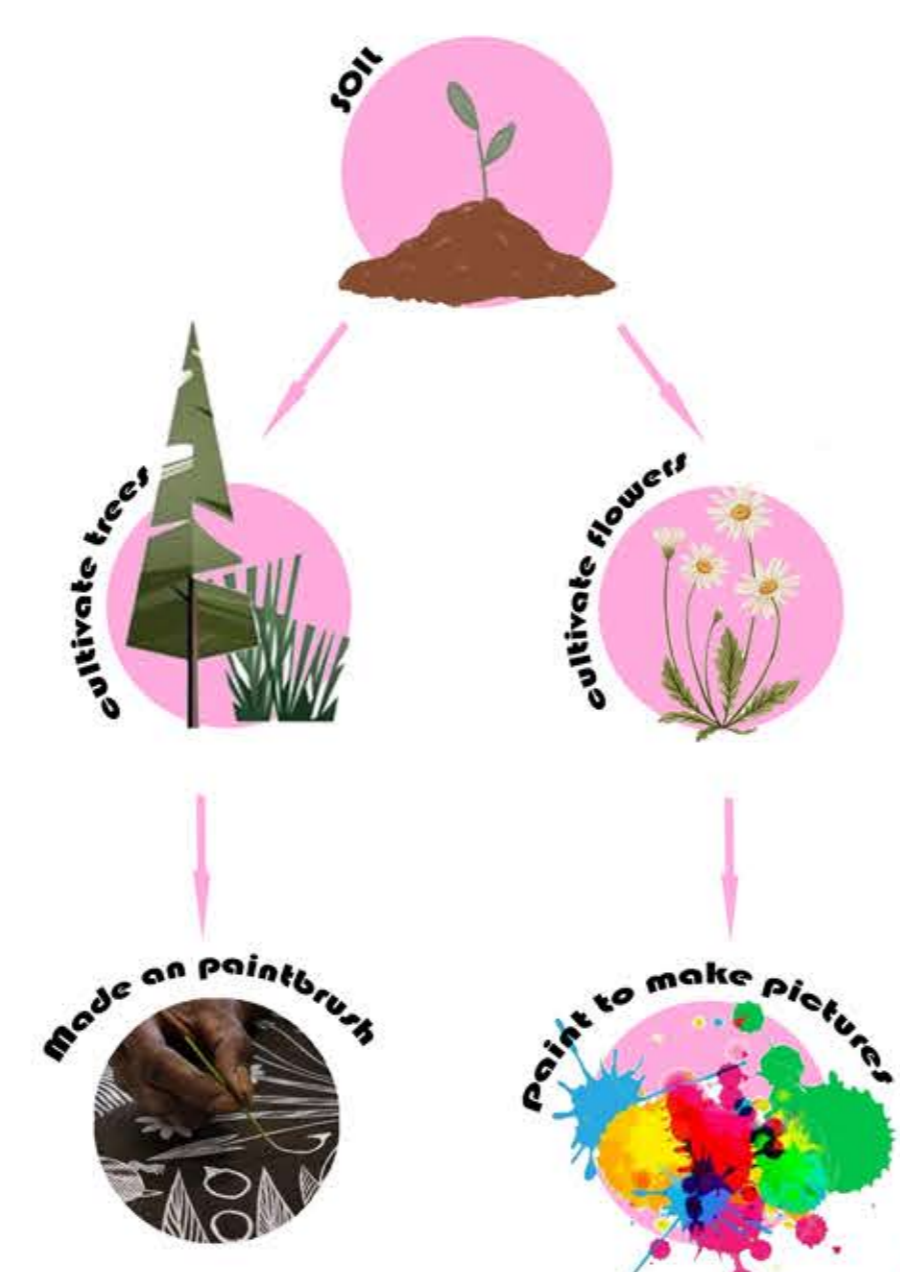
"Spirit of the Land" draws inspiration from the deep spiritual connection that First Nation peoples have with the land, water, sky, and all living beings. The design concept embodies principles of respect, reciprocity, and reverence for nature, reflecting the sacred relationship between humans and the natural world. Elements such as sacred geometry, traditional motifs, and natural materials are incorporated to evoke a sense of place and belonging.



The rain garden is a fundamental component of the "sponge city" design concept. In essence, a sponge city aims to mimic the natural water cycle by absorbing, storing, and using rainwater, rather than simply letting it run off. This approach helps manage urban flooding, replenish groundwater, and mitigate pollution.

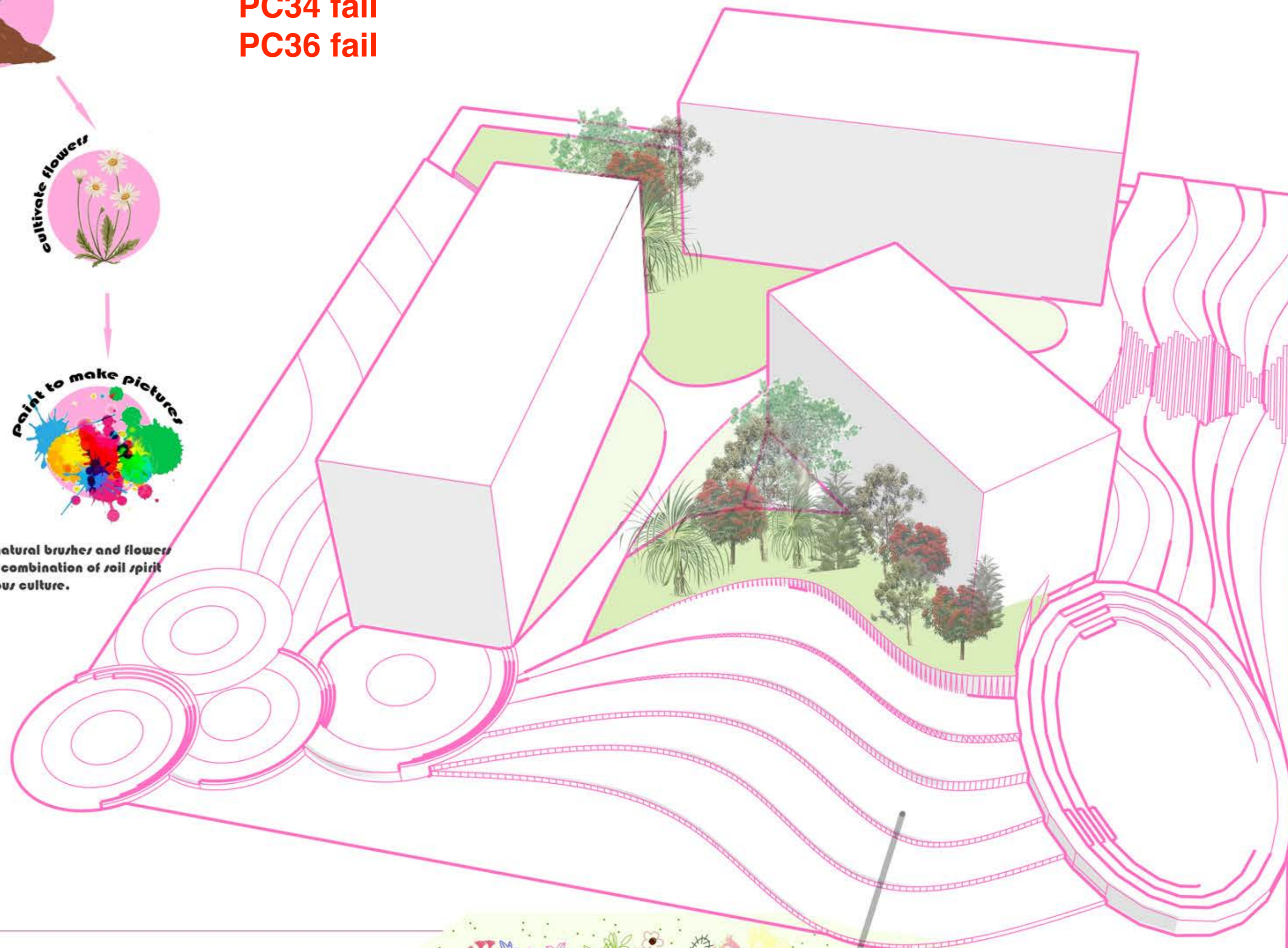


Rain gardens consist of plants, soil, and sometimes specialized media that filter pollutants from the rainwater as it percolates through the garden. This helps improve water quality by removing sediment, nutrients, and contaminants before the water enters groundwater or nearby water bodies.



Painting on the land, using natural brushes and flowers as pigments, embodies the combination of soil spirit and indigenous culture.
